Introduction

It has been said that history does not repeat itself, but it often rhymes. 

Objective: To assess the frequency of symptoms in a general population sample over the previous week and the associations between symptom reporting and demographic factors, medical visits and medication use.

Design: A representative general population sample (n=1000) was recruited using random digit dialling. Participants were asked whether they had experienced any of a list of 46 symptoms in the previous 7 days and if so, whether the symptom was mild, moderate or severe. Demographic data and information on medical visits and medication use were also collected.

Results: Symptom reporting was very common. The median number of symptoms reported by participants in the previous week was 5 with only 10.6% of participants reporting no symptoms. The five most common symptoms in the previous 7 days were: back

Strengths and limitations of this study

- Our participants were a large representative sample that allowed us to estimate the prevalence of a wide range of symptoms in the general population.
- We used a longer symptom questionnaire than in previous research. This allowed us to assess a greater range of symptoms experienced in the previous 7 days.
- The survey was conducted during the New Zealand winter period and this may mean that flu and cold symptoms are more prominent during this period.
- The survey was reliant on self-reported symptoms and it was not possible to check the veracity of participant's symptoms.







The source of a mysterious hum on the Shore is yet to be found.

It has been almost a year since Massey University Albany senior lecturer Tom Moir and lecturer Fakhrul Alam started investigating the hum heard by a number of residents in Birkenhead, Albany, Glenfield, Takapuna, Torbay, Orewa and Whangaparaoa.

The story, originally reported in the North Shore Times, made headlines as far as Sydney.

"Some people have said it's almost as if somebody had switched something on next door, or nearby, and others have reported burns on their bodies," Dr Moir says.


"I have been unable to find the cause of that. It could be just a medical condition."

The hum is said to be a low-frequency buzzing said to make those who hear it feel sick or suffer sleep deprivation, eye strain, nose bleeds or heart palpitations.

It is reported to have been heard as far back as 1970 on the Shore and as far away as the Scottish seaside town of Largs and Taos in New Mexico.


